<u>Historical footnote</u>: At the request of then AISD Superintendent Lynn Hale, all city high schools were asked to organize an alumni association. These associations would be a part of the AISD Education Foundation. AHS Principal James Adams recruited Cathy Bontley Brown, '63, to organize just such an association in 1996. An organizing committee came up with the plan that is now ours. For three years, the Arlington High School Alumni Association functioned under the bylaws of the Education Foundation. Its primary function was to raise money for grants to innovative teachers via the Foundation. Consequently, our alumni have been supporting this effort since that time. In 1999, our Association separated from the Foundation and began to function under its own bylaws. Our support of the grants program continued, however, with our donations being earmarked either for Arlington High or the junior highs and elementary schools whose students eventually go to AHS. We are proud to support the creative teachers who want the best for current and future Colts.

What we will continue to do, however, is award our 2020 seniors scholarships with the highest stipend ever of \$1,500. Because we plan to award ten this year, by graduation 2020 the Arlington High School Alumni Association will have given over \$188,000 to Arlington High School students, staff, organizations. For a group of people who just happened to graduate from the same high school to love that school enough to support it years after their graduation—that's Spirit! American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics, the Society of Professional Engineers, Freshmen Leaders on Campus. I took part in the Leadership Honors program. 


