Charlie was the third president of the Arlington High School Alumni Association. During his three year tenure, the Association established a Scholarship Fund and began awarding scholarships to deserving seniors. Since then 30 scholarships have been given by the Association totaling \$29,200. His family designated the Alumni Association Scholarship Fund as one of his memorials. What a great way for AHS alums to honor the memory of a great Colt running back and a class act of a man!

In an interesting twist, Lamar grad Scott Peach, CBC, son of legendary LHS coach Eddy Peach, is our head coach at AHS...Filmmaker Will Canon, '97, had his first full-length feature film, *Brotherhood*, premiered at the prestigious South by Southwest film festival in Austin in March. Nearly 4,000 films were submitted and his was chosen to be one of only eight in the narrative feature competition. The film was shot in Arlington at a former UTA fraternity house on Abram Street...Gari Davis, '80, a neo-natal intensive care nurse at Medical Center of Arlington, appeared in "The Baby Story" on The Learning Channel on April 1. She was taking care of the twin girls featured in the show.

<u>Notable</u>: Earlier this year Distinguished Colt Alumna Beverly Bohannon Reynolds, '48, in conjunction with the Arlington Historical Society, published "Arlington in World War II." The booklet chronicles life in Arlington and its changes around the war years. Its primary focus is on the lives of the 46 young men who died in service to their country. For \$20, both those who lived those days in Arlington and those who didn't can gain a perspective, an appreciation, and a personalized history of that time.
