North Texas Giving Day Report

Debbie Ericson, past president of our Association and now chair of our efforts for North Texas Giving Day campaigns reports our success beyond all expectation in the 2020 fundraiser. **Grand total:** = \$11,248.48.

Our donors include 16 sponsors who pledged between \$100 and \$1,000 apiece. Thanks to our board members who offered this chance to 14 vendors and two family funds. This raised \$5,300. Donors mailed in checks for \$1,295, and 51 unique donors online gave \$4,796.94. Special shoutout to one completely anonymous donor (we have no idea who so we couldn't send a thank you!) who gave \$500. Many, many thanks to all of you. With no events possible in 2020, you came through for AHS! Kudos to

our social media guru Mac Martin, Debbie's second in command for his online efforts. Overall, the response to this area-wide event raised \$58,827,500 from 197,620 donations alloted to 3242 organizations.

Of course, Phyllis went on to become beloved "Teach" to her legion of AHS students...a note from Bonnie Beebe Watkins and Mike Farhat, Class of 1962: Their classmate Jimmy Ashworth suffered a severe neck injury as a Colt football player. From that moment he never walked without crutches. With that true, indomitable Colt spirit, Jimmy lived a successful life. As a teenager, he voiced the live, caged bird who talked to passengers waiting in line for the Six Flags Railroad as it circumscribed the park. This led to a career with Six Flags Corporation where he climbed the success ladder working at several parks across the country, including his final stop in Ohio. Jim always admitted, even after moving away from theme park entertainment, that he was "a carney at heart."
