



FFA Members Receive PBR Donation Through Efforts at Pancake Breakfast

In September, the Arlington FFA was invited to work a pancake breakfast at the Cowtown Coliseum in the historic Fort Worth Stockyards. The organization has been working with the Professional Bull Riders Tour and the Texas Rattlers over the past few months to help advertise, plan, and promote the annual PBR Pancake breakfast supporting the local FFA chapter. Over 55 FFA students, parents, and volunteers showed up and worked by running food, serving pancakes, bussing tables, and walking up and down the stockyards getting the word out to come and eat and donate.

“All of our efforts paid off when our FFA members were invited to the live bull riding event Saturday evening to receive a check from the Texas Rattlers GM Chad Blankenship,” Tanner Smith, AHS Ag teacher commented, adding that \$10,000 was donated to the AHS FFA Chapter.

A portion of that amount will be shared with a neighboring chapter; however, AHS will be on the larger end of the distribution.

“This is an amazing opportunity for our FFA members to experience a one-of-a-kind event at Dickies Arena and start to cultivate relationships with PBR, Texas Rattlers, Community

Our students and parents deserve all the credit and praise because they are the reason all of this is possible. I am so proud of how they represented

Arlington FFA, Arlington ISD, and themselves.”

This is an annual event that the Texas Rattlers PBR team wants to make bigger each year in order to give more financial assistance. “We are so thankful for this partnership and for all the belief they have in our Ag/FFA program in AISD,” Smith concluded.
