

The Association and The Foundation

On February 27, the Arlington ISD Education Foundation held its Awards Banquet at the Arlington Convention Center. Educators, community leaders and business leaders applauded the **Arlington High School Alumni Association** as it received the **Leadership in Education Award** from the Foundation. One organization each year and four individuals are honored by the Foundation. In years past, three alumni have received this award: **Tom Cravens, '60, Beverly Bohannon Reynolds, '48, and Jannette Workman, '54.** Past president **Jim Ball** accepted the award on our behalf and 18 members of the Association were present as a group.

The following week **Cathy Bontley Brown**, '63, and **Mary Tom Cravens Curnutt**, '84, delivered the happy news to Sarah Valentino, music teacher at Crow Elementary, that she had received the **Arlington High School Alumni Association** grant from the Foundation. Because we give \$3,000 each year to fund our grant and the request was for more than that, the AISD Education Foundation co-sponsored the grant so that it would be fully funded at \$5,000. This grant, named "Music Comes Alive Through Technology," will be used at Crow year after year inspiring hundreds of future Colts and preparing them for the musical opportunities ahead at AHS.

In addition to these efforts, the Alumni Association, working with local preservationists, has agreed to purchase a marker to be placed on the property. The marker will read as follows: Arlington's first public school, County School P.S. 48, opened in September 1896. The Arlington Public School District—now AISD—was established in July 1902, and built its first school, a combination elementary/high school, in 1903. Steady growth moved AISD to build a new Arlington High School on this site in 1922. In 1957, it became the city's first junior high school and operated until 1968, when UTA bought the academic complex for use. This is Arlington's longest-standing monument to public education.
