"Dream Job" Becomes Reality -

Trophy Coordinator Travels with Ultimate Baseball Prize

ast year, Cheryl Hardy
—Springer's job didn't exist.

But that all changed when the Texas Rangers won the 2023 World Series and Cheryl was hired as one of two "Traveling Trophy Coordinators."

Cheryl has been working for the baseball organization for the past nine years in various jobs from Guest Service Relations to Security.

"I heard some employees saying that they had filled the position. Since I applied and not heard anything," Cheryl said, "I got on the phone with the person hiring and told her I wanted the job and wanted to talk to her." Shortly after that in-person meeting, Cheryl had the job.

And what exactly does a Traveling Trophy Coordinator do? "We take the trophy, named the Commissioner's Trophy, out on tour to various cities, making sure it gets there safely." Cheryl replied. "We've traveled to Round Rock, Houston, Frisco, Oklahoma City and are going to North Carolina. Some other visits are with partners the Rangers have, but we also visit City Council meetings and City Libraries." Fans are encouraged to come out and take photos with the trophy.

"At some of the home games, we pass out tickets to the first 250 who enter, who can have their picture taken with the trophy here," she added.

Playing drums in the high school band may have equipped Cheryl to handle the 30-pound trophy, made of sterling silver and 24-karat gold. Each of the 30 gold-plated flags around the base represents the 30 MLB teams in the league, and is made new each year by Tiffany's.

One of the perks of the job includes driving a new Toyota Sequoia to carry the trophy around in, Cheryl noted, adding that "we even strapped the trophy to the top of the vehicle during the July 4th parade in downtown."

Since the winning team keeps the trophy each year,

Cheryl hopes her "dream job" will continue and she can continue to travel across the state and show off the trophy.

The next traveling tour schedule covers most of the East Texas area, beginning in Greenville, all the way to Texarkana and down to Shreveport and back.
